The Association has general meetings on the 3rd Tuesday of each month, all are welcome to attend and bring friends and neighbours. The next meeting is June 19. General Guildford matters will be discussed, particularly the assessment of the historic town for heritage listing – see below. All welcome.

HERITAGE LISTING A STEP CLOSER

In a landmark day for Guildford, on Wednesday June 6 Heritage Minister David Templeman announced the historic town will be formally assessed for inclusion in the State Register of Heritage Places.

Speaking on behalf of the Minister at the Rose & Crown, Midland MLA Michelle Roberts said Guildford was rare as a highly intact 19th century town that still retained its original grid layout around a central square.

The Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage will be seeking comment from the local community in September, and Ms Roberts urged everyone to have their say to protect our beautiful townsite for future generations.



Mayor David Lucas said he and then Mayor Mick Wainwright and CEO Mike Foley visited Mr Templeman 18 months ago when he was shadow Minister for Heritage.

"We told him of the importance of trying to get the town protected so more multi-storeys like the one just across the road from here are not approved," he said. He said he was delighted the wishes of the Guildford community have been heard and acted upon.

While assessment is underway, all development applications will be referred to the Heritage Council for comment.

BOOST FOR HISTORICAL SOCIETY

At the Wednesday June 6 City of Swan council meeting the Swan-Guildford Historical Society was granted funding to continue to engage a part-time curator, plus additional funding to engage the services of an education tourism coordinator, two days a week.

The Swan Guildford Historical Society collection was formally accessed in 2010 as the third most significant collection in Western Australia, surpassed only by those of the Western Australian Museum and the Royal Western Australian Historical Society. The collection contains many objects that have national and state significance

100 TERRACE ROAD

The Willing building at 100 Terrace Road is near completion. This was opposed by the City of Swan on three occasions with the Joint Development Assessment Panel (JDAP) as being inconsistent with the Guildford Conservation Precinct Policy and Guidelines, however, the majority of the JDAP panel voted to accept the building, and overturned the City of Swan position .



GUILDFORD CELEBRATES BUT MIDLAND'S STILL FIGHTING



CITY OF SWAN SPECIAL MEETING OF ELECTORS MONDAY JUNE 18, 5.30PM, MIDLAND TOWN HALL.

While heritage protection for Guildford is heading in the right direction, the bulldozer has moved in on the 118-year-old Midland Oval. The City is proceeding with plans to develop the site, which

includes putting a road through the oval. Residents have long argued the public open space is needed more than ever considering the high density residential developments planned for the area, and want to see the oval developed as a central park; an inter-generational recreational space with development around it, not on it. They are also concerned that under the current plans, historic homes on The Avenue could be lost. If you value heritage and public open space, please attend the meeting on Monday. The picture was taken at a snap rally on the oval on Sunday June 10, 2018. Kalamunda MLA Matt Hughes, Tim Clifford MLC, Rev Alison Gilchrist, Christine Hughes, Callan Gray and Francesca Irwin were among those who camped out on the oval this week over two cold nights as a protest against the imminent arrival of the bulldozer.
