Centenary of Artillery in Guildford

This highly successful commemorative event was held in Stirling Square on Sunday 3 November 2013. The event recognised 100 years of the Artillery in Guildford and South Guildford and was held in conjunction with Gunner's Day. A parade was led by a military band with servicemen, reservists and cadets. A

service was given by the Chaplain from Guildford Grammar School, the Rev Dr Philip Rayment. A plaque was unveiled by the Mayor of the City of Swan, Charlie Zannino, and the newly installed Hobbs Gate was dedicated. Wreaths were also laid at the War Memorial by community groups, including the Association.

The Hobbs Gate is in memory of Lieutenant General Sir Talbot Hobbs who was instrumental in the design of many significant public buildings and fine private residences in Perth and Fremantle in the early 1900s and was a decorated soldier having commanded troops in the Great War and other conflicts. The Memorial Gate is constructed using the gates and timbers salvaged from the original entry gate to Sir Talbot Hobbs' own residence in Peppermint Grove.

The Centenary of Artillery was attended by many local dignitaries, members of the Royal Australian Artillery Association (WA), Guildford Grammar School and the community. An informative exhibition was held in the Guildford Town Hall and the City of Swan provided a very fine luncheon.

Our sincere thanks go to the City of Swan for making this historic event possible and to those who participated. Guildford Hotel

The damage to the Guildford Hotel by highly visible graffiti is extremely disappointing. This building does not deserve such indignity but neither does it deserve to remain unprotected for so long and in a state of abandonment by the owners. We receive continual reports that things are being done but the lack of positive visible work on the site is disturbing.

This is a situation that would not be tolerated in other States or overseas yet the destruction of heritage buildings and demolition by neglect is rife in Western Australia. The Association calls on the State Government to step in and save the State and Nationally listed Guildford Hotel from further damage and to strengthen the Heritage Act so that this situation cannot happen to other important heritage buildings.

Development on Floodplain

The Association is extremely alarmed to learn of the rapid progress apparently taken by the City of Swan to relocate the Swan Valley Visitor Centre to the Caversham floodplain. Not only is this an environmentally irresponsible proposal but it flies in the face of all reports done about Guildford over the past 20 years, with community input, <u>none of which advocate major development on our</u> <u>valuable floodplains</u>. The Association is very disappointed that no consultation has been undertaken with the Guildford community on this matter and we fear that by the time community submissions are sought, it will be a done deal.

We also question why thousands of dollars of ratepayers money may be spent on upgrading the Museum Precinct in Meadow Street if tourists and visitors in cars and buses simply bypass Guildford to go to the new Visitor Centre over Barker's Bridge and then continue on to wineries and chocolate factories. Our local businesses may suffer if there are fewer tourists to Guildford to support the shops, cafes and restaurants if the Swan Valley is the only focus. We are intrinsically linked to the Swan Valley but we want tourists and our local Western Australian community to appreciate Guildford too. The Association has written to the City of Swan to request information about this matter.

Aircraft Noise

It is very important that you report any significant aircraft noise so that the Association can continue to push for a better deal for noise impacted Guildford and South Guildford residents. If there is a "go-around", that is when an aircraft is instructed not to land after it has already started its low descent over Guildford and South Guildford, this creates significant noise intrusion. Imagine if you had just come home from shift work and were trying to get to sleep? Please report any noisy aircraft or notable increase in aircraft movements on **1800 802 584**. It is a free call and you will be making a difference.

Did you know?

The Vaudeville Theatre in James Street, next door to the Guildford Hotel, was Guildford's first purpose built theatre. It was designed by architect GWE Broome and built in 1897 by *Mr* George Hiscox who also built the hotel. In recent years, it has been used for car smash repairs and a home furniture and giftware shop. The property has recently been sold to new owners who, we understand, are researching the building's history and will hopefully give the old theatre new purpose.
