Guildford Hotel Rally

The rally held by the **Save the Guildford Hotel** on Saturday 2 February was well attended by Guildford residents and supporters. The three main political parties were represented. The Keynote Speaker was John Griffiths from the Swan Valley and Regional Winemakers Association. John spoke about the intrinsic links between the Swan Valley and Guildford and stressed how important this State and National heritage listed building is to the region.

The current State Government has placed its faith in the landowners who are now advertising for expressions of interest for leasing and developing businesses on the site. There is still concern that no work will commence on restoration of the Guildford Hotel before it sees its 5th winter without a roof. We ask how much longer the Guildford community must wait and see?

Guildford's Houses

Guildford's houses are an integral part of its history and heritage. The Guildford Conservation Policy (1992) states that; "All buildings which contribute to the streetscape be conserved in accordance with the Burra Charter...." Guildford's classification with the National Trust depends on the retention of the road pattern, streetscape, houses and buildings. This principle is also enshrined in the City of Swan Local Planning Policy C-106 - Guildford Conservation Policy.

The Association will, therefore, vigorously oppose the demolition of pre 1940s buildings in order to uphold the principles of these policies and because the retention of all pre-1940s building stock is fundamental to the Town's conservation value and heritage listing. We cannot allow "death by a thousand cuts." Every building matters – from workers cottages to our fine hotels.

It is perhaps timely to remind ourselves that conservation of buildings is not new. We would not have many of the fine public buildings and private homes we have now without the diligence and commitment of earlier generations over the past 100 years. We are indebted to them.

We also acknowledge and congratulate all those who care for, restore and preserve Guildford's built heritage with all the challenges and rewards it can bring.

2013 State Election
