We will be continuing our monthly meetings with a range of guest speakers. The New Year has got off to a great start with the wonderful news below...

CITY OF SWAN COMMUNITY CITIZEN OF THE YEAR

Congratulations to Guildford resident and GA vice president Mrs Barbara Dundas, for being named one of two Community Citizens of the Year at the City of Swan Australia Day Citizenship Ceremony. Mrs Dundas, pictured with Mayor Mick Wainwright (left) and Cr Ian Johnson, was praised for her "admirable and inspiring

passion in preserving and promoting the historic significance of their local area, and has done so volunteering for more than 30 years."

In the citation, Midland-Guildford ward councillor Ian Johnson said Mrs Dundas "has been the driving force behind numerous large scale projects, worked with local and politicians, universities and community groups. Her hard



work and dedication has been of great benefit to the local area and beyond, placing this historic region on the map."

It is fantastic that Mrs Dundas' enormous contribution to the Guildford community over many years has been recognised in this way.

TRAFFIC ISSUES

Our next meeting is on **Tuesday February 21 at 7.30pm** at the Mechanics Institute Hall, 20 Meadow Street, Guildford. Officers from the City of Swan will be talking about local and regional traffic issues affecting Guildford and how planned road works may reduce the volume of through traffic in the town.

We will get an update on our request to slow traffic for a trial of 50KM through the town.

Meetings are held on the 3rd Tuesday of each month, all members are welcome to attend and bring friends and neighbours.

WARD CHANGES

The City of Swan is reviewing its wards and representation. The status quo is not an option, because there is currently an imbalance in representation across the wards. A discussion paper on the City's website provides a number of options to consider. Members of the public have until January 31 to make a submission. Here is a quick summary of the potential impact on Guildford of the proposed options.

Option 1 in the discussion paper proposes no changes to the current Midland/Guildford ward boundary and representation. *Comment Guildford would continue to share 3 councillors in a ward with similar profiles, history, environment etc. The Option retains the current 6 ward system whilst providing for new growth*

Option 2 would reduce the number of wards from six to five and see Guildford and South Guildford separated. Guildford would be transferred from the Midland/Guildford ward to Swan Valley/Gidgegannup ward. South Guildford would remain within the Midland ward. Guildford would be represented by different councillors.

Comment This option gives 2 councillors. Guildford would compete for resources with new suburbs with different needs.

Option 3 would reduce the number of wards from six to four and the number of councillors from 15 to 13. The Midland/Guildford ward boundaries and representation would remain as is, with changes impacting other areas. *Comment This option may not be popular with other wards and does not distribute councillors adequately for the future.*

Option 4 No wards, and retain or reduce councillor numbers.

This means there would be no 'go to' councillors specifically representing the interests of Guildford. Please note the majority of metropolitan councils have a ward system. The Town of Bassendean has no wards but has a population of around 16,000 compared to 140,000 in the City of Swan.

Comment This option requires all councillors to be familiar with all areas. Guildford's unique identity and needs are unlikely to be well represented.

The GA Executive Preferred Option

Option 1 is the preferred option in our view, as it makes sense to have older established areas of the City of Swan including Guildford, Midland, Woodbridge, Hazelmere and Bellevue together as they share similar characteristics and interests.

HERITAGE LISTING UPDATE

Do you think your property is worthy of heritage listing or an upgrade of heritage listing? The City of Swan is conducting a Heritage review. It is seeking suggestions of properties that should be added to the Heritage List or the Local Government Inventory or have their importance upgraded. Heritage places can be buildings, structures, landscapes and archaeological sites. New guidelines which have been prepared by the State Heritage Office also now include the significance of the interior of the property. TREE DECLINE IN GUILDFORD

The Eucalyptus rudis has long been thought to be resistant to phytophthera, however, Professor Giles Hardy of Murdoch University has noted that the decline has the appearance of dieback. Recent soil testing around a sick tree on private property showed the tree had Phytophthera.

The City of Swan, EMRC and Prof Giles Hardy are working together and seeking funding for:

- i. A paired scientific study of trees on the Guildford floodplain.
- ii. Training residents on how to inject trees both on public and private (their own) properties.



Similar community programmes exist in Mundaring and Kalamunda, in conjunction with the EMRC.

If you are concerned that your E.rudis tree (flooded gum) is declining, please contact your local tree specialist. If Phytophthera is suspected, you may be able to treat it with an injection of Phosdine, Phosjet or similar product. You may also wish to make



arrangements to have soil tested through the Centre for Phytophthora Science and Management at Murdoch University. This costs approx \$150. The cost of treatment will depend on the size of the tree and your tree specialist.

Canker of some sort also

seems to be occurring in some of the exotic trees, eg, Ficus Oak and Claret Ash. Please report any unusual patterns of tree loss or decline on City of Swan reserves and bushland to CoS officers.

Your Association will keep you updated about the coming workshops and trials we hope will be started later this year.

In August 2017 the Association will be again working with Murdoch University to bring another scientific seminar on Tree Decline.

STIRLING SQUARE IMPROVEMENTS

The Stirling Square Working Group - with representatives from Guildford community groups is an initiative of the Association. lt was established to review outstanding work in Stirling Square and to make future recommendations for future repairs and work. The Working Group is pleased to advise that the City of Swan has acted on a number of these recommended actions. We thank them for the following work:

1. Completion of the drainage around the Stirling Memorial Gates in Stirling Square consistent with the Conservation policy, and to prevent future damage to the carved lime stone bricks.

2. Replanting the old rosemary hedges around the War Memorial to further enhance the landscaping of this area.

3. Investigation into future restoration of the Memory Gates, which are showing signs of rust. The Gates can no longer be opened for ceremonial use, due to rusting of the locks.
