THE GUILDFORD PAUSE – AIRCRAFT NOISE RESEARCH

March 20 meeting Acoustic expert Mr John Macpherson, F.A.A.S., will present the latest findings on research into aircraft noise and health, as part of the World Health Organisation (WHO) review of its Environmental Noise Guidelines for the European Region. The findings were released late in 2017 in the form of 'systematic reviews' of the literature by expert panels, with the most robust positions to date on the effects of noise on heart disease, stroke, obesity, diabetes and birth defects.

This is an important talk for all Guildford residents and the surrounding communities including Woodbridge and Midland, which will be aircraft noise affected within the next 10 years with the planned parallel runway.

GUILDFORD HERITAGE LISTING

Exciting times for Guildford ... A majority of residents and ratepayers have given a big tick to the prospect of Guildford Historic Town being listed on the State Register of Historic Places. 420 responses to the survey were received, with 89 per cent supporting our town's nomination. The matter is

on the agenda of the March 14, 2018, City of Swan council meeting, when council will vote whether to support the nomination. The Council report notes an "exceptional high response rate, overwhelmingly in support".

MLA Michelle Roberts has been a strong advocate of the move and would like urgent interim listing to be granted by Heritage Minister David Templeman to prevent a flood of planning applications.

She said ongoing speculation could lead to planning applications from those wishing to get approvals in place ahead of any listing.

Also on the agenda for this month's council meeting is a report into the **future of Guildford Library**. Key aspects include increased opening hours and building up of resources. This is very positive and we hope Council will support the recommendations arrived at through community consultation via the Friends of Guildford Library.

Please attend the council meeting and support these items. The meeting will be held Wednesday March 14 at 5.30pm in the Council Chambers above the Midland Library, next to the Town Hall.

Based on community feedback, the City will not be pursuing reinstating the entry statement at the west end of Guildford. New entry signs are to be placed on all entries to Guildford, four at bridges and one by Guildford Grammar School, the eastern entry to Guildford.
