THE GUILDFORD LIGHT HORSE STATUE

A committee was formed late last year to work towards achieving a Light Horse Memorial in Stirling Square as part of the Centenary of Anzac commemorations. We thank Ken Wyatt, Michelle Roberts, Charlie Zannino, SGHS, GA, members of the 10LH people for their support on this committee. The 10th Light Horse Regiment was formed in Guildford in 1914 and St Matthew's was their Garrison Church. The City of Swan has overseen the tender process



and three artists have been short listed. To achieve a fitting memorial it will be necessary to raise funds; this is to be co-ordinated by the Swan Guildford Historical Society, which has charitable status. We excitedly await more news of this wonderful project.

STIRLING SQUARE IMPLEMENTATION GROUP

The Stirling Square Working Group has come up with a number of ideas and recommendations for maintenance and improvements in Stirling Square. Many different community groups met to share ideas and recommendations. We thank the City of Swan for their support. A new implementation committee has been formed and we will start to see new work including additional seating, rubbish bins, lighting etc over the next few years. More contentious issues such as protecting the sugar gum trees from root compaction and car parking will go out for public comment.
