SWAN VALLEY TOURIST BUS

A daily bus service for tourists has been launched in the Swan Valley. The circle route, departing from Guildford Station, will take visitors along West Swan Rd, Great Northern Hwy and Reid Hwy, allowing them to hop on and hop off and visit attractions along the way. All day tickets are \$20 for adults, \$15 concession, \$50 for family – two adults and up to three children. An annual pass for City of Swan residents is \$60. RATEPAYER AND RESIDENTS UNITE

Representatives from community groups around Perth rallied on the steps of Parliament House on Wednesday Nov 7 to 'Stop the Rot' - calling on the government to plan better for communities, people not profits, trees not concrete, transparency, better community consultation and to scrap the DAPS (development assessment panels). Clive Ross, President of the Swan Foreshore Protection Assoc Inc, said there were over 80 groups across Perth all facing the same problems and announced efforts to establish a combined group, the WA Resident and Ratepayers Assoc, to work for change.
