SUGAR GUM ANNIVERSARY ART CELEBRATION

Head to **Guildford Library** to see some of the fantastic entries in the *Living Memories, Sugar Gum Art and Poetry Competition* that marked the 20th anniversary of the saving of Guildford's iconic sugar gum trees from removal.

Guildford Pre-Primary student Isha Menon (pictured, courtesy Sheldon Levis, Dusty Dingo Photography) was the overall winner with her artwork "Sugar Gums at Night."

Around 200 people, including 40 finalists and their families, attended the awards presentations at Guildford Grammar School's Foundation Pavilion on October 20. Four local schools participated, with 192 entries.

Guildford Association President Barbara Dundas congratulated the students and described it as an



important event passing over the knowledge and story to a new generation of 'Sugar Gum Guardians.'

"History has to be known and valued by the local community and what better way than celebrating through the educational curriculum," she said.

"We are very proud of our young local people. Twenty years ago, these beautiful trees faced removal and it was only through the concerted efforts of community that they were saved. The story must be passed to new generations."

The competition was sponsored by the City of Swan, the National Trust of WA, Eastern Metropolitan Regional Council, Guildford Potters and the Guildford Association.

GUNNERS' DAY

Thanks to all those who took part in the 91st Gunners Day in Stirling Square in Guildford on November 3. The parade was attended by Brigadier Colin Moore of the 13th Brigade who flew from Canberra for the occasion, bringing with him the 9th Regiment Standard.

The parade was led by the Australian Army Band, Gunners past and present, serving officers and soldiers of 3 Battery RAA and members of the Australian Cadet Corps. The service was conducted by Bishop Jeremy James and Rev Katrina Holgate.

Local Government Minister David Templeman has announced the formation of an expert panel to progress the development of a new Local Government Act for Western Australia.

Meanwhile, the Parliamentary Select Committee Inquiry into local government is underway, with former state parliamentarian Larry Graham due to appear before the public hearings at 1.30pm on November 18.
