


Fuildford Hotel - The local community action group continues to apply pressure on the uthorities and owners of the Guildford Hotel to ensure an appropriate restoration of the building undertaken. There was a rally in mid-August at which over 1200 people attended to emonstrate the depth of community anger about the situation. Since then, the wonderful Chris avenport sparked a spontaneous "smelly socks" situation that has grown to festoon the hotel afety fencing - letting all and sundry know that the Guildford Hotel is "on the nose". At the last bunt there were over 600 smelly socks strung succinctly on the fencing and more being added aily. It is rumoured that the council has issued a work order to the owners to remove the ffending material forthwith.

To assist, we ask residents to email the Premier and/or the Heritage Minister:

- complain about the plight of the Guildford Hotel,
- request a review of Heritage Legislation that is blatantly failing
- ask what they will do to avoid the Guildford Hotel following the path that befell our other local Midland hotels, namely
 - o the Council Club (arson 1990, demolished 1994),
 - o the Stockman's Hotel (arson 1996, demolished 1998)
 - the Railway Hotel (arson 1999, demolished 2004)
 - o Will it be the Guildford Hotel (arson 2008, demolished????).

<u>Iew Airport Access</u> - it may not be commonly known to Guildford Residents that the irport authority has recently opened an internal ring road connecting the domestic terminal to the iternational terminal. The new road is an extension of Dunreath Drive from the Domestic recinct and links to Horrie Miller Drive at the International precinct. The road reduces the ansfer time between the two sides of the airport to just 10 minutes and means that you no longer ave to use Tonkin Highway or Great Eastern Highway to get between the International and longestic Terminals.



Airport News - Guildford residents have long been represented on the West Australian Airports Management Committee by the tireless Barbara Dundas. It is a very important and argely thankless task that she undertakes on behalf of the community. I personally wish to nighlight her contribution and publicly acknowledge the great work she does for Guildford and he surrounding suburbs. With the significant increase in flights from Perth Airport and the resultant rise in complaints from surrounding suburbs, it is absolutely critical that Guildford naintains a voice and a presence in this matter. We become complacent with time and I urge residents not to simply accept the deteriorating situation as a "fait accompli". Our silence, relative to other affected areas, is interpreted as an acceptance of the situation and we will see an ncrease in flights both in terms of frequency and hours of operation that will continue to diminis our quality of life in Guildford.
