HERITAGE LISTING FOR GUILDFORD

The Guildford Association applauds the recent decision of the City of Swan to commence a process for the registration of the historic town of Guildford on the

State Heritage List. Note the town was previously nominated for State Registration in 1995 and again in 2004.

All of the actions for listing the town are consistent with the City's endorsed position in the 2013 Heritage Strategic Plan

Benefits of State Heritage Listing include:

- State recognition of the cultural heritage significance of Guildford may provide opportunity for Federal Heritage Listing and possibly World Heritage Listing.
- Will provide recognised legislative protection for the town at all levels of government, preventing confusion, misunderstanding and reduce possible administrative conflicts.
- Will provide access to possible future State and Federal funding opportunities for the town, for projects relating to streetscape management eg. trees, landscapes, parks, underground power and streetscape groups of buildings.
- Will provide recognition of Guildford town and the Swan Valley area for advocating and promoting tourism in WA.
- Places the City of Swan as a manager of a significant State Tourist and Cultural Heritage Feature, with associated recognition.
- Value adds to the Guildford community (residents and businesses), both in the town and surrounding areas).

The Guildford Association thanks the City of Swan for the maintenance of the commemorative bench marking 2009 — Year of the Sugar Gums. This seat was erected through the City's community arts funding program in 2009 to mark the 10 years since the council agreed to keep and maintain Guildford's sugar gum plantings, dating back to 1897. We thank the city for their support and for the maintenance work involved, such as powder coating of the bench.
